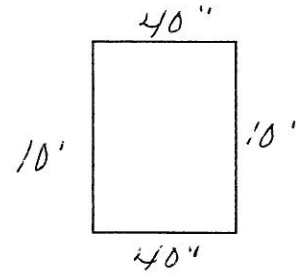
Foundation Regulations for Greenlawn Cemetery

1. Single Grave-Size

A. 10'x40"x40"x10'

Foundation-Size

36"x12" or 38"x12" or 36"/38"x14"



Most markers are usually placed at the foot of the grave. This is why they are called a foot marker. Except a slant, they usually are placed at the head of the grave because they can be used as a head stone.

The difference between a foot marker and a monument is monuments consist of two pieces. The top is called a tablet which is sealed to the top of the base. The base sits on the foundation.

The monument and also markers aren't to be over 14" wide. Anything wider than that has to be removed and another foundation put in when we have a burial on the lot.

2. Two-Grave Lot-Size

A. 10'x80"x80"x10'

Foundation -Size

36"x12" up to 60"x14"

Two grave lots have four(4) corner post that are 6"x6" anything over the 60" covers two corner post at the head of the grave. Anything over the 14" width also prevents the burial without the removal of the monument and the foundation.

The only time this doesn't happen is on the older lots that have existing burials on them or the lot is larger than two graves.

Most monument companies phone the cemetery before they sell larger monuments.

These regulations have always governed foundations in Greenlawn Cemetery.
